



BACHELOR IN DEVELOPMENT FINANCE (BDFin)

INTRODUCTION

BDFin is a highly demand driven internationally recognized professional program affiliated to Kathmandu University. Started in 2006, this highly structured and dynamic program is tailored made to take on the challenges discussed at the Third International Conference on Financing for Development, held in Addis Ababa, in July 2015, in the pretext of Nepal committing to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by 2030.

NC takes pride that the issues raised in the Addis Ababa Action Agenda viz. using national development strategies and plans, and adopting an integrated national financing framework, are virtually all covered in the 4 years (8 semesters) course of 131 credits. The subjects on institutional structures, policies and strategies give testimony to the fact.

The Federal Democratic Republic of Nepal, still being a least developed country, has an increasingly complex landscape of development finance, and needs able human resource to manage and mobilize the unprecedented financial resources required to meet the target of becoming a middle income country by 2022 and achieve SDGs by 2030.

MISSION

To produce human resource that can adapt and maneuver in the fluctuating finance landscape and be able to fill financing gaps Nepal faces.

PRORGAM OBJECTIVES

The BDFin program attempts to equip its graduates with necessary knowledge, skills and attitudes to analyze the nature of financial institutions, project management, and entrepreneurship development. The program focuses on practical field based learning right from the first semester, which later changes forms as internships and an independent research based project work in the final year.

PROGRAM SIGNIFICANCE

The BDFin program adopts the interdisciplinary framework incorporating subjects from Business Finance, Economic Development, and Entrepreneurship Management. The solid foundation of business finance, the inclusion of subjects from sustainability in development, the enhancement of the entrepreneurship, management, and marketing skills leading up to the vital research ability, the BDFin program graduates have thus earned the ability to lead the Nepalese and global economy and financial markets.

PROGRAM PROSPECTS

BDFin graduates have job opportunities in the financial sectors (banks and insurances), microfinance and cooperatives, enterprises development institutions and research institutions within governmental, non-governmental and private organizations. But, above all, as independent researchers and business entrepreneurs, the graduates have excelled.

The BDFin program graduates are qualified for Masters in Development Finance, Master in Business Administration and Masters in various fields viz. Economics, Management and public policy.

BACHELOR OF SOCIAL SCIENCES (BoSS)

INTRODUCTION

Designed for the study of societies with a holistic approach, the Kathmandu University affiliated Bachelor of Social Sciences (BoSS) program focuses on the dynamics of the contemporary Nepalese and global societies.

This 'semester system' program spreads over 8 semesters in 4 years. Each semester consists of 16 intensive study weeks – theoretical and practical. The course contains 128 credit hours including 3-credits internship and 6-credits project works.

MISSION

To produce social researchers, policy analysts, and social entrepreneurs with a capacity of building excellent social relationships.

PRORGAM OBJECTIVES

To equip the program graduates with the significant knowledge, skills, and attitudes to analyze the policies affecting the society and work as social change agents. Upon the completion of the program, the BoSS graduates will have the critical/ creative reasoning, decision making, leadership, and communication skills and a better understanding of the dynamics of contemporary Nepalese and global societies.

PROGRAM SIGNIFICANCE

BoSS program addresses the needs of holistic study of social dynamism rather than the study done in isolation. Social sciences are inter-related to each other. Only the integrated study can provide the students a complete picture of the national, the regional, and the global societies.

PROGRAM PROSPECTS

BoSS graduates will have job opportunities in the Social Organizations, Policy Institutions and Research Institutions, I/NGOs, Government Organizations and Private Sectors. They will also be able to work as independent researchers and social entrepreneurs.

The BoSS program graduates are qualified for Masters in Sociology, Anthropology, Culture, Philosophy, Social Psychology, International Relations, Public Policy, Master in Development Studies (MDevS), and socio-economic related interdisciplinary programs among the others.

BACHELOR IN DEVELOPMENT STUDIES (BDevS)

INTRODUCTION

An internationally recognized and demand driven program affiliated to Kathmandu University, the Bachelor in Development Studies (BDevS) emphasizes sustainable development and practices introducing the scholars an interdisciplinary study of Economics, Sociology, Environment, Development Management, and Research. This semester system program spreads over 8 semesters in 4 years. Each semester consists of 16 intensive study weeks – theoretical and practical. The course contains 127 credits.

MISSION

To produce sustainable development practitioners, entrepreneurs, and researchers.

PRORGAM OBJECTIVES

Upon the completion of this program, the BDeVS graduates will be equipped with the necessary knowledge and practical skills on GIS (Geographical Information System), Environmental Impact Assessment, Project Management and Evaluation, Development Research, and Community Mobilization.

PROGRAM SIGNIFICANCE

The BDevS courses are conceived by the development experts, practitioners, and academicians with inputs from the local communities and international professionals. The course structure addresses the development issues of the developing countries like Nepal in the regional and global contexts. The dynamic courses give room for the faculties to incorporate the contemporary local and global development issues within the outlines of the syllabus.

PROGRAM PROSPECTS

There is a high need of sustainable development practitioners in the developing countries like Nepal and the BDevS graduates are fulfilling this demand. The BDevS graduates from National College have been working in the NGO/ INGOs led development projects, government organizations, donor agencies, and corporate sectors, independent research works along with their self-employment projects.

This program's graduates are qualified for the Masters in Development Studies (MDevS), Masters in Sociology, Economics, Environmental Studies, Human and Natural Resources Management, Regional Planning, International Relations, Development Management, and other socio-economic related interdisciplinary programs including MBA among the others.

FACULTY AND THE STUDENTS WORKING TOGETHER FOR KNOWLEDGE GENERATION







The academic environment at National College gives enough space and opportunity for faculty and students to work together for knowledge generation. One of such platforms is the regular field visits in each semester to different parts of the country. Faculties and students come together for the planning of the field, site identification and designing the research tools. In the field visits, students explore pertinent issues related to the courses being discussed in the classrooms. At the end of such trips, students present their findings to a wider audience consisting of faculty members, classmates as well as guests.

During the field studies, students undertake various research tasks under the guidance of the faculties and the local resource persons. The tasks include field observation, household survey, focus group discussion, interviews, interactive meetings, consultations etc. In doing so, at the end of the course, our students become well equipped with the research, report writing and presentation skills.


The field sites include some of the significant locations such as:

- Built landscapes (towns, villages, highways, canals, dams)
- Sensitive sites (customs, depots, immigration, dry ports, hydropower stations, factories)
- Demonstration and research stations (drinking water, garden, horticulture, knowledge park, livestock farms, museums, visitors center, zoo etc)
- National parks, conservation areas, buffer zones, community forests
- Natural landscapes (rivers, mountain tops, caves, gorges, cliffs)
- Shrines, heritage sites

Along with the learning opportunities, students get life experience of trekking, homestay, local hospitality, exotic food, cultural values as well as exposures to diverse climatic conditions and geographical landscapes. The motivated students also get opportunities of learning and testing various skills such as photography, bird watching, field identification, and social works. Many students end up conducting their final year Project Works in these sites as they become familiar with the place and people.

The districts that are generally covered during the field studies include:

Bara, Baglung, Bhaktapur, Chitwan, Dhading, Dhanusha, Dolakha, Gorkha, Kabhre-Palanchok, Kaski, Kathmandu, Lalitpur, Lamjung, Mahottari, Makawanpur, Nawalparasi East and West, Nuwakot, Palpa, Parbat, Parsa, Rasuwa, Rupandehi, Rautahat, Sindhupalchok, Syangja, Tanahun, Sindhuli, and Sarlahi.



UNESCO Goodwill Ambassador Madanjeet Singh (April 16, 1924 - January 6, 2013)



In 2012, National College with the cooperation of the South Asia Foundation (SAF) has established the **UNESCO Madanjeet Centre of Development Studies and Regional Cooperation (UMCDSRC)**. The UMCDSRC has been offering the fully-fledged Madanjeet Singh Group scholarships for a bachelor level course on development studies and regional cooperation at the college. The scholarship includes travel, board, lodging and tuition fees, to South Asian students, based on gender equality. These students will be one from each of the eight SAARC countries – Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Maldives, Nepal, Pakistan and Sri Lanka. Under the scholarship scheme, five scholars of the first batch (one each from Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Nepal, and Sri Lanka) have graduated in 2016, and there are three batches comprising of six students currently studying in the college.

PRACTICAL, RESEARCH, AND SKILL ENHANCEMENT (PRSE)

The objective of introducing the Practical, Research and Skill Enhancement (PRSE) sessions to the BDevS, BDFin and BoSS programs is to impart critical and analytical **Thinking, Reading, Writing** and **Research** skills to the students that are required for conducting efficient field research and data analysis. The skill is also subjected to adhere students for the proper understanding of the subject matter. The non-credit based training methodology module, especially focused to the first year students, also aims to support students for their academic and professional growth through the acquisition of soft and practical skills.

Nepal-Japan faculty Students Exchange Program

Students exchange has been in practice since 2005, when Mushashi Institute of Technology, Japan collaborated with National College to conduct spring and summer projects in Nepal and Japan in March and August respectively. This program, now, has come a long way even after 13 years as 87 Nepali students have visited Japan (fully sponsored by the project) and more Japanese students have visited Nepal than this number. The project, being supported by the Ministry of Education, Japan till 2017, now is supported by the Ministry of Science and Technology, Japan under Sakura Research Grants effective from August 2018 to March 2021. This has paved the way for ten National College students and a faculty every year to visit Japan for research and exposure. More than 30 students will be benefitted from this project in the coming 3 years.



Nepal-China Cultural Exchange Program

National College also initiated a venture with Confucius Institute through Confucius Institute in Kathmandu University (CIKU) where National College faculty, staff and students get opportunity to visit China every year under education, learning and cultural exchange between these two countries. Eleven National College students along with three professors have completed their fully sponsored visit to China since 2014. The collaboration is in continuous process where more students and teachers/professors can take benefit from this international students and faculties exchange program.



Nepal Bangladesh Collaboration for Internship

Thengamara Mohila Sabuj Sangha (TMSS), one of the most prominent Bangladesh based development institutions has been providing opportunities for National College students for the research based internship opportunity. The institutions itself being one of the best in world has been the dreams for many local and international students where three National College students did their mandatory internship from. Two students from BoSS and one from BDFin successfully completed their three-month internship in December 2017.



Comparative Environmental Studies with Paul Smith's College, USA

National College Kathmandu and Paul Smith's College (PSC) of USA have initiated joint field studies in Nepal under the envisioned program of cultural and academic exchange between their students and faculties. In May 2018, students of both the colleges have conducted field research as a part of the PSC's course entitled "Comparative Environmental Studies Practicum in Nepal" in the Annapurna Conservation Area in June 2018. Arrangements have already been outlined for the reciprocal visits of National College students and faculties in USA under the invitation of PSC team. Authorities of both the colleges have agreed upon to continuing the exchange program, so that both the students and faculties will share their ideas and values on conservation and development.

The students get to learn not only the subject related aspects but also acquaint themselves with life skills through guest lectures.

At National College, guest lectures receive high priority and every faculty members are encouraged to bring in guest lectures with different set of activities.

BEYOND CURRICULUM

National College equally emphasize on co-curricular activities for the holistic growth of the students. Different co-curricular activities are designed to develop myriads of techniques and skills in the students which are much needed in their professional career.

Commemorating the 20th anniversary of the college, students have initiated several series of innovative programs including Annual Dialog Series in Collaboration with Community Self Reliance Center (CSRC), Graduate of the Month, Life Talk, Maile Dekheko Samaj among others.
