- All students fulfilling the criteria of CDC / NEB are eligible to fill up the admission form for shortlisting.
- Candidates may apply for only one group: Biology or Computer Science. The group once chosen cannot be changed in any case.

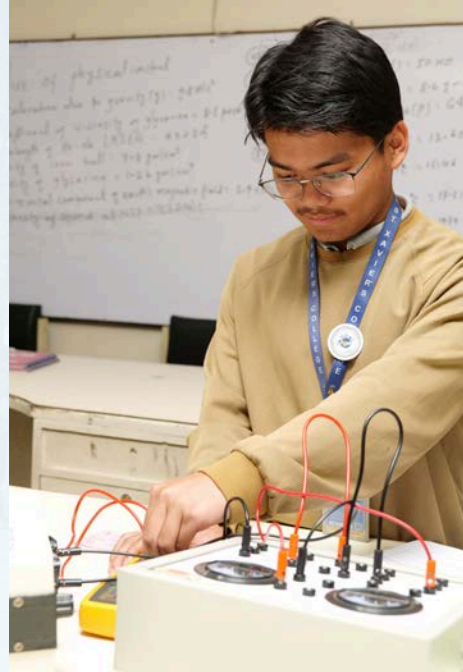
# Extra Curricular Activities

# CLUB ACTIVITIES

## SXC Science Fest

The SXC Science Fest is organized through the collaborative efforts of various student clubs of the College, including the Computer Club, Physics Club, Ecosphere Club, Sodalitas de Mathematica, and Club de Chemia. It serves as a platform for students to engage in innovative, interactive learning experiences through activities such as Human Chess and Human Ludo, Escape Rooms, Treasure Hunts, Periodic Table Activities, and Atomic Model Demonstrations.

## SET Walkathon

The SET Council organizes the SXC Walkathon along with a Wheelchair Rally to promote social awareness, inclusiveness, and community engagement. The event witnesses enthusiastic participation from students and members of the community. The proceeds collected from the program are dedicated to organizations working for social causes, particularly in support of people with disabilities and independent living initiatives.

## SET Exhibition

The SET Exhibition, organized by the SET Council, serves as a national platform for students to showcase their creativity, scientific knowledge, and innovative ideas related to social upliftment, environmental conservation, and technological advancement. Recognized as one of the College's major academic events, the exhibition encourages innovation, research, collaboration, and practical learning among students.

## Annual Sports Day

The Sports Club organizes an annual two-day sports competition for students of the NEB Program. Students participate in a variety of sporting events, including basketball, football, chess, and track competitions. # Student Counseling

- Yearly fees do not include NEB Registration and Examination fees. These charges must be paid separately as prescribed by the National Examination Board.
